
As Orange County Supervisor, Don Wagner was honored to celebrate Indian Republic Day as a distinguished guest of the Indian Association of Southern California.

Seventy years ago — on Jan 26, 1950 — the Constitution of India replaced the Government of India Act (1935), establishing a new sovereign nation. Supervisor Wagner appreciated the opportunity to recognize the independence of the world's republic here in the world's oldest republic.

District Representative, Deepak Sahni, took to the stage and encouraged the Indian community to participate in OC's dynamic government, providing broader representation at the local level. Supervisor Wagner also presented a Certicate of Recognition to the Indian Association of Southern California, thanking it for providing excellent cultural opportunities that highlight why people want to build a life here.

Ending a 30-Year Backlog of Rape Kits

Supervisor Wagner and DA Spitzer secured funds to help sexual assault survivors at the Board of Supervisors meeting on January 28. While the County is caught up on processing current rape kits, both of cials are committed to working together to clear the 30-year backlog.

"Because rape kit DNA testing can bring closure to the victims of these horrible crimes, we cannot accept continued delays when the resources are available to us," said Supervisor Wagner.

On February 11, DA Spitzer will bring before the Board of Supervisors a contract with a third-party vendor for Sexual Assault Kit testing services for \$612,000; grant money that will assist in clearing about 50% of the gap. Following Supervisor Wagner's direction and Board approval, DA Spitzer will revise the contract to include the \$400,000 in 14J funding as a solution to complete the entire backlog.

"Clearing the backlog of sexual assault kits has been a priority of mine since I was a County Supervisor, and I have doubled down on that commitment," said District Attorney Spitzer.

January 20 — The County now requires a 1000-100t buller between sober living operators; the item brought forward by Supervisor Donald P. Wagner passed unanimously at the Board of Supervisors meeting. The ordinance tightens permit requirements for group homes, including sober living homes with six or fewer occupants to have a 24-hour on-site manager, among other mandates. Additionally, sober living homes now may not operate within 1,000 feet of each other nor of any other State-licensed recovery residence. "The separation makes sense in my district's more rural, unincorporated areas. I thank my staff and County counsel who worked swiftly with our community to address this problem," said Supervisor Don Wagner. In September 2019, Supervisor Wagner led the Board to unanimously pass the initial County-wide ordinance, including requiring group home operators to apply for a permit and to enforce "good neighbor" policies. The policy was initially brought forward by Third District Communications Director, Rachel Lurya, who is a constituent of the unincorporated areas. Unincorporated County areas have seen a proliferation of sober living and group homes in residential neighborhoods. Many such houses do not provide in-home treatment and are not regulated by the State of California. "The amended ordinance balances our ethical duty to help the men and women in these treatment programs to get their lives back in order, while also protecting the safety of our neighborhoods," Wagner added. "As Supervisor, my efforts to curtail an over-concentration of group homes help secure the peaceful nature of our familyfriendly neighborhoods." Cowan Heights Remedial Street, Curb and Gutter Repairs



Project Summary

OC Public Works will complete remedial concrete and asphalt repairs to various roads within the unincorporated Orange County area of Cowan Heights. Access to residences may be limited during normal working hours, depending on the location of the work. Advanced notification, door hangers and "No Parking" signs, will be provided 48 hours prior to construction activity. If you require special accommodations, please contact OC Public Works directly at the contact information provided below.



OC Public Works will seal cracks in the roadway and replace sections of deteriorated asphalt concrete pavement, curb and gutter, curb ramps and cross gutters within Cowan Heights in preparation for a future roadway resurfacing project. See the reverse side for a detailed map of the project area.


