Dear Valued Resident,

Nearly a year has passed since schools, event venues, and businesses across the country began shuttering their doors to thwart Covid-19. Since then, many parents have been forced to choose between work and helping their children with schooling, as kids have moved from classroom to at-home Zoom sessions. Stress is up in kids who have lost social outlets and parents who have lost income opportunities.

COVID remains a real danger to some, though there are promising developments. But the state's blanket response has proven to cause significant harm to our community at large. From multiple scientific reports, there is little evidence that schools have contributed meaningfully to increased community transmission. OC schools with waivers have been operating with little to no significant outbreaks to date.

I continue to urge the state to get our kids back in school, out on the playing fields, and in the gym; the science says that we can do it safely, and that's what is best for young people.

In my recent <u>Town Hall</u> with OC Health Care Agency Director, Dr. Clayton Chau, I asked about COVID's toll on our youths' mental health. Last year, OC Health Care Agency


isolation could cause kids to suffer psychologically, destroying their motivation to learn. He noted the importance of children learning in school to gain critical skills to compete in the world.

The drastic drop in new Covid-19 cases, combined with reports from CDC officials that demonstrate schools can open safely, should be viewed as an opportunity to resume inperson learning.

The goal of in-person education and a reopened economy is close. As vaccine supplies increase, the county's recently launched <u>Operation Independence</u> aims to vaccinate all willing Orange County residents by July Fourth. This would be the perfect time for our schools to provide an abundance of summer school classes to help kids catch up or participate in engaging enrichments. We must continue to stand up for our kids and fight for them. Let's help them get ready to tackle the 2021-22 school year – and the future! – by demanding our schools reopen.
