


U.S. ARMY IS HIRING!





THIRD DISTRICT, CA — Our well-rounded community is what makes Orange County a solid place to live, work, and raise a family. As part of Supervisor Wagner's COVID-19 Relief Program, he has allocated grants for arts-related small businesses and nonprofits located in our Third District because the arts sector has been hard-hit by the pandemic. Grants for the Small Business Relief Program are set at \$20,000 (flat-rate); applications will be considered on a first-come, first-served basis. Awards will be issued in one single payment.

Reimbursement is for expenses incurred since August 1, 2020 - present (provided that other relief program funds were not received to cover the same expenses). 2021 Redistricting Public Workshops

Every ten years, local governments use new Census data to redraw their district lines to reflect how local populations have changed. This process, called redistricting, is important in ensuring that each board member represents about the same number of constituents. In Orange County, the Board of Supervisors is responsible for drawing supervisorial districts.

Join us at a public workshop in August to learn more about the County of Orange's 2021 redistricting process. Each workshop will include a brief presentation and an opportunity to ask questions and provide feedback on redistricting including communities of interest. TUSTIN, CA — In 2012, Team Wagner Field Representative Al Murray was the Mayor of Tustin. He asked his dentist, Dr. Chuck Tozzer, to consider doing a Tustin Dental Clinic at the Tustin Family and Youth Center because many people cannot afford dental care. The facilities service families in Southwest Tustin.

July 10th was the 8th Annual Clinic — last year it was closed due to the pandemic.

On behalf of Supervisor Wagner, Al Murray presented Certificates of Recognition to Barbara Guerrero and Dr. Charles Tozzer for their partnership and community support through Tozzer's foundation, "Dental Care for Children".

At the annual event this year, the clinic serviced 49 patients for free or on a sliding scale; services typically cost \$350 to \$400 per patient. For that, we thank Tustin Dental Clinic and Tustin Youth Center for supporting our community's health and giving people a good reason to smile.



ORANGE, CA — Supervisor Wagner was honored to present a proclamation to retiring Orange Police Chief Tom Kisela, who officially retired on July 1, 2021. Chief Kisela was the second Orange PD Chief who spent his entire 35-year career with the Orange PD. SUPERVISOR WAGNER CONTINUES TO VOTE "NO" ON THE STREETCAR PROJECT



ORANGE COUNTY, CA — Supervisor Wagner serves as a director of the Orange County Transit Authority (OCTA). Before the start of his tenure, OCTA has been building an unnecessary and greatly overpriced "streetcar" project in downtown Santa Ana.

The project has disrupted hundreds of Santa Ana merchants, commuters, and residents, adding insult to the injury of the pandemic shutdowns. The project is budgeted at over \$100 million per mile! And it continues to face unexpected delays that raise the cost even further. Numerous change orders, in the multiple millions of dollars, have been considered by the OCTA board and routinely passed over Supervisor Wagner's objections.

Be assured, he will continue to vote against further waste on the streetcar, and against waste on all of the boards and commissions he serves on. Supervisor Wagner believes the people of Orange County are overtaxed at all levels of government for wasteful projects and Orange County governments should not contribute to that over-taxation.
