

## **COVID INFORMATION & RESOURCES**



Thank you for reading this news bulletin and for staying up to date on county issues. At the forefront of most everybody's mind remains the pandemic. Despite some commentary on social media and in other places, the county remains committed to providing you with the latest information on the effects of Covid in our community and the resources available to you to keep yourself and your family safe. It is simply not true that the county has stopped informing the public,

through the media or otherwise, on the course of the disease.

My staff and I have prepared the following list, with links to county resources, to assure you that the information we all need remains available and transparent, and, more importantly, to give you a single place – this news bulletin – for you to go to stay informed.

General Information: The county Health Care Agency (HCA) website, occovid 19.ochealthinfo.com, is accessible to the public and provides links to case counts, including equity initiatives, health of. cer orders, general FAQs and latest news. Links to prevention, which includes information for unvaccinated individuals, information for vaccinated individuals and testing information. This site also provides the public with information on how and where to get tested, the latest vaccine news, where vaccinations are available, vaccine taskforce meeting information, the current number of vaccines administered in OC, vaccine aftercare, and vaccine effectiveness. The site also includes mental health information.

Covid Numbers: HCA updates the county's Covid numbers on a daily basis (case data reported each day has approximately a one-day delay from the time HCA receives reports from CalREDIE until reported on the website). Other information available includes Covid cases in schools, and Covid cases by city. CEO/HCA Media Brie ngs: County CEO Frank Kim and County Health Officer Clayton Chau have a weekly media briefing conference call on Fridays to provide media outlets with an update on the county's Covid-19 response, and any new orders from the State Public Health Officer. The media briefing is also the place where media outlets can ask questions of CEO Kim and Dr. Chau. My office is provided with the dial-in information which we will share with any district resident upon request.

**Additional Covid Brie** ngs: In order to keep other community leaders fully informed, Dr. Chau and his staff have a weekly conference call with all OC School

District Superintendents and a bi-weekly conference call with OC Mayors. HCA also updates me and my colleagues by email on a weekly basis, usually on Thursday evenings or Friday mornings, to keep the Board members and our staffs apprised of vaccination information and all other Covid issues. This email, along with the weekly numbers, are then posted on the OC Health Care <u>Agency's Facebook</u> and <u>Twitter</u> pages.

**Social Media**: Between August 1, 2021 and August 31, 2021 HCA had 329 posts regarding Covid information on Facebook. Between August 1, 2021 and August 31, 2021, HCA tweeted 395 times regarding Covid information. Access the Agency's Facebook and Twitter accounts to receive these updates.

**Public Hotline**: The OC Covid-19 Hotline is available to answer questions about vaccine-related issues, including booking appointments, location selection, or assistance with transportation. Live operators are available Monday - Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at (714) 834-2000.

John Wayne Airport Launches WebTrak Application

(SANTA ANA, CA) – On September 1, 2021, John Wayne Airport successfully launched WebTrak, a web-based flight tracking system that shows aircraft flight activity in the vicinity of the Airport and surrounding neighborhoods.

The application supports a public access platform providing residents with the ability to view and research flight activity and provide feedback on noise events.

Residents are able to utilize user-friendly tools in WebTrak to locate a date and time of interest and display relevant flight activity. The system has been fully integrated with the current Noise Event Portal, Viewpoint, allowing individuals to report a noise event directly from the WebTrak map interface tool.

This interactive, map-based tool provides visual information on aircraft as they depart and arrive at the Airport. The data posted through the application enables the community to see actual flight tracks and noise levels in a way that is easy to understand and facilitates investigation of noise concerns. Everything that is presented through WebTrak is in near real-time, delayed for security purposes, and identical to the data that the Airport utilizes in their Airport Noise and Operations Management System.

John Wayne Airport has one of the most stringent aircraft access and noise monitoring programs in the United States and, perhaps, the world. For more



YORBA LINDA, CA —Supervisor Wagner attended a special remembrance ceremony at the Nixon Library on Saturday, September 11, 2021.

The outdoor hybrid event featured 23 tons of wreckage from New York City's World Trade Center, while the Orange County Fire Authority drove a fleet of trucks with Ladder Truck 32. The displays serve as a civics education for young people — a reminder of the tragedy that took place on American soil 20 years ago.

Traditions included paying tribute to those who tried to help others in the attack, a presentation of the colors, singing of the National Anthem, and musical performances by the Orange High School Concert Choir, the Orange County Chamber Singers and Masters Choral, and the Villa Park High School Band.
